

LOWER SCHOOL SUPPLIES LIST

Kindergarten Supplies

8-pack crayons (please, only send in an 8-pack) – skinny crayons, please
 4-oz. bottle of washable glue (no glue sticks)
 1 pair of safety scissors
 2 pencils
 One (1) 2-pocket folder
 1 backpack (no wheels!)
 2 boxes of tissues, Clorox wipes
Please label all supplies with your child's first name and send in all supplies on the first day. You will need a duplicate of the above supplies to be kept at home for homework. In addition, you will need a set of index cards to be kept at home.

Grade 1 Supplies

3 Composition notebooks (marble type)
 3 Folders with pockets at bottom of folder
 1 Spiral notebook
 1 School box for desk to hold supplies (standard size)
 1 box crayons (24 pack or smaller)
 Colored Markers (1 box of 8-10)
 Glue Sticks
 Scissors
 12 sharpened pencils, #2
 1 eraser with name or initials on it
 (1) 9X12 Envelope
 2 boxes of tissues, Clorox wipes
 Colored pencils (1 box of 12 or smaller)
To keep at home: Addition flashcards, sums to 20. Also subtraction flashcards, differences from 20

 2 Folders with pockets with names on them, please
 5 Spiral notebooks OR 5 Composition books (wide-rule) with names on them, please
 6 Folders with brad clips to hold in papers – with name on them, please
 Pencils, 1 doz.
 Crayons
 Magic Markers or Colored Pencils
 2 Glue Sticks
 1 School box for desk to hold supplies
 Scissors
 2 Erasers
 2 boxes tissues

 5 Pencils at all times with erasers
 2 boxes tissues for classroom, Clorox wipes

Crayons and colored pencils (no markers)
 8 Spiral notebooks
 Flash cards – Add/Subtract and Multiplication/Division
 Loose-leaf paper (wide-ruled)
 2 Big pink erasers
 Red erasable ink pen
 Scissors
 (1) 12" ruler
 Yellow highlighter
 Glue stick
